# MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT SEPTEMBER/OCTOBER 2024

Sadly, the end of summer is once again upon us! Just a reminder, all township schools open on September 5th, so please be aware and drive with care!

We apologize for the confusion about Club swim lessons this year. We thought we had enough guards to run the lessons, but unfortunately, that was not the case. We hope to have a program back up and running next year. Also, with many guards leaving for college, we had a few days where the beaches were not covered. As we always stress, water safety is everyone's responsibility when they enter the water. Parents should always have an eye on the water when their children are in the water. The guard's final weekend is Labor Day.

Thank you to Swim Team Chairman Amy Szekula, our swim team committee, our coaches, Jamie Breiten, Kevin Denbleyker, Sam Iversen, Maura White and all our parents for another great swim season. Once again, our team received the Sportsmanship Award!

The Board amended a standing rule at its July meeting regarding the use of Club property for personal business. The new rule is as follows:

Club properties may not be used for the conduct of personal business or the sale or storage of personal property without prior approval from the Board of Governors, except boats that comply with the current boat storage policy. Personal business includes all activity where one is collecting payment for a product or service, regardless of the age of the individual conducting the business or the type or status of the business. The sale of personal property shall include food or other items offered for sale for personal profit or for fundraising purposes. Exceptions to this rule include Club sponsored events and/or prior Board approval consistent with signed vendor agreement. Requests for approval shall be made through the Club office and are subject to Board approval.

Thank you to Kristen White and the Social Committee for all the great summer events and year-round work. We have one last summer event planned for August 31st to finish the summer, so be sure to come out for our annual "Goodbye Summer Beach Party."

Reminder: this is a draw-down year. We will open the low-level outlet on October 1st, and will only remain open as per our permit until November 15th. Please line up your contractors if you plan on doing any work and inquire about any possible permits required before you do any work.

All boat storage permits expire this year, so all boats, kayaks, paddle boats, etc, will have to be removed from Club property by November 1st. This allows the Club to repair racks and remove any unclaimed property left on Club property.

Thank you all who volunteered for our Night Security patrols this season. It was great to see some new volunteers this year; it helps to protect our Club properties. Once again, I am happy to report that it was an uneventful summer season.





#### **Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings**

July 12, 2024

The Social Committee reported on recent events including the Kid's Color Wars/Biathlon, the Fourth of July Bike Parade/Start of Summer Celebration, and a Beach Bonfire. All events were well attended. In addition, an Ice Cream Social, Movie Night and an Adult Dance Hop were all great events.

The Board was updated on the Lake Ecology including recent surveys and treatments. A half an acre of filamentous off 3<sup>rd</sup> was discovered, but wind took it over the spillway. Another half an acre of filamentous near the North shore was treated; despite the warm temperatures, weeds are not taking off.

There was a discussion on a possible hydro raking project for the fall after the lake drawdown.

Summer Night Security patrols began last weekend and will continue nightly through Labor Day.

Mr. Nick Stanton was hired as fill-in Beach Security; he has been doing a great job of checking for badges and parking passes.

Unfortunately, due to a lack of interest from the lifeguards, swim lessons were cancelled for the season. There was a discussion on updating the lifeguard contract to include more responsibilities including swim lessons.

The Fishing Committee reported their last fishing tournament was held in the evening and despite the heat they had their biggest turnout of 19 fishermen. Six bass were caught along with lots of pickerel. The next event is next Saturday. A kid's fishing tournament is scheduled for August 16<sup>th</sup>.

The Swim Team reported that their season began at the end of June and is in full swing. The Tribe has had several meets (2 wins and 3 losses), a lake swim from 3<sup>rd</sup> Beach, and a Ribbon Meet held at our facility. The team has a meet away tomorrow vs. Shongum Lake followed by a team outing to Sussex County Miners game, and two more meets next week including their final home meet vs. Lake Forest on July 20<sup>th</sup> which will be their Senior Day. The team will then attend Silvers and hold their team's breakfast banquet at the Club at Picatinny. Preparations continue for hosting Trials and Finals at Roxbury in August.

The dock decking at the Clubhouse was repaired and resurfaced, the air conditioning unit was serviced and repaired, weeds on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Beach property were treated, and repairs were made to the dock at White's Cove. The White's Cove dock still need to be resealed/ resurfaced and parking signs will be ordered for the properties. The Board discussed trees on all Club properties; several trees will be trimmed or removed in the fall after the drawdown.

The Capital Improvement Committee reported that they recommend replacing the sea wall at 2<sup>nd</sup> Beach during the upcoming drawdown. It was determined by the Committee that the project is the most cost effective, allows us to complete the work that has already been done on the top portion of the property, and they prioritized projects that need to be completed during the drawdown.

The Board contracted a company to redo our plans for Phase II of our dam project as required by the NJDEP. They will update and redo the analysis that Mr. Remsen completed back in 2012. The cost will be rolled into our loan for Phase II of the project.

The Sailing Committee held Intro to sailing lessons on June 18<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, and 22<sup>nd</sup> as well as a week-long sailing camp. On June 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday Sails started with good turnouts dependent on weather. Committee Chair Tom Preston thanked Bobbie Harris, Brian and Bruce Bulloch and Jason Marks for their assistance.

The Board was updated on issues with the sale of the North End property and the lot line adjustments due to a lien on the properties from the SBA loan for Phase 1 of our dam repairs. There was a discussion on the options for the Club at this time.

The Swim Team asked the Board for their permission to rename the Snack Shack in honor of Suzie Iversen, which they approved.

#### August 2, 2024

All summer events have been awesome with great turnouts and lots of great feedback. Pirate Day was well attended although it ended in a monsoon. Thanks to Ms. Troha and the lifeguards for a great event. Once again, this year ice cream was donated from the owners of Denville Dog & Grill for all events and for the Swim Team.

Lifeguard coverage for August may be an issue with many guards heading off to college; it was determined that 3<sup>rd</sup> Beach will go without coverage and if no one is available, 1<sup>st</sup> Beach, as well.

The Swim Team had a great season with 3 wins and 6 losses. Many swimmers made it on the podium at Silvers, the dedication of the Snack Shack to Suzie Iversen had a great turnout and the family was very appreciative, and the team held their annual awards breakfast at the Club at Picatinny Arsenal. The Tribe hosted Trials yesterday at Roxbury, which was a huge success with lots of community spirit. Tomorrow is Finals with 6 swimmers from the team advancing.

The old picnic tables at 1st Beach have been removed. The floating dock at 3rd came loose; it was retrieved and replaced.

The Board discussed the issue with our SBA loan and the property sale at North End and lot line adjustments including a possible solution to offer easements on the properties at no cost to the Club.

The Board discussed and approve a change to the Standing Rules regarding conducting private business on Club properties. The change would require a permit from the Club and proof of insurance.
