

We started on July 28th at the Clubhouse with a sailing instruction presentation, complete with ice cream sundaes, and since then we have taken out more than sixteen newbies to experience the pleasure of sailing for the first time. These new sailors will soon be sailing solo. Every week, we see new faces and we have the opportunity to start them sailing. It's not too late to join them. Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

Board of Governors Meeting July 7, 2023

The Social Committee reported that June Wine Tasting had a great turnout, the Ecology Seminar was unfortunately cancelled due to weather and air quality, and Trivia Night was once again a hit. The Kickoff to Summer was light in attendance due to the weather but Social Committee sold Lake Shawnee Merchandise, Board members sold hot dogs out of the Snack Shack, the Swim Team had a table for information, the Seniors held a Bake Sale, and a DJ played music and held kid's games throughout the day. The second annual 4th of July Bike Parade was a hit with over 30 kids in attendance with a JTFD fire truck to lead the parade. Thanks to Ms. Megan Grisi for organizing the event.

Upcoming Social events include Ice Cream Socials/Bingo on July 11th and July 25th, Kids Biathlon on July 21st, Movie Night/Campout on July 22^{nd,} and Storytime on July 27th.

It was reported that Solitude treated several times this season including filamentous at North End; the lake looks great. Mr. Keith has put a lot of time and energy into the treatment of the lake and tries to inform the membership with his articles and at the Annual Meeting; if anyone wants more information, please call him. We try to make sure the lake is the best for all members including boaters and fisherman. There are currently only 4 geese on the lake - two males and two females, and they shouldn't mate this late.

Summer Night Security will begin in July. We are lacking volunteers but will continue the service for as long as possible.

It was reported that Mr. Max Russell is doing a good job as Summer Security. We have a full staff of guards and are offering kids' swim lessons again the summer.

The Fishing Committee has held two great tournaments this season so far. At the first tournament, not many fish were caught, but the second was much better. The fish caught have been really healthy. The committee will not be stocking the lake this year; they did last year and plan to do it again next year.

The Swim Team Car Wash was a huge success; the kids had a lot of fun and lots of parents assisted. The Snack Shack is off to a great start and has already shown a profit. Upcoming events include a home swim meet tomorrow with a tribute to Al Gazdalski. His family will be in attendance and all Board members are invited to attend. Swim Team President Mr. Bill Szekula will speak as well as Board President Mr. Eric Wilsusen. A ribbon meet will be held in Lake Shawnee on Monday.

The Board discussed the status and progress of the Property Lot Line Adjustments.

The Board discussed the issues of members' trees that are encroaching onto the lake.

It was reported that three dead beavers were found on the lake. They were disposed of properly by Mr. Keith; he will address the issue in his next edition of Ask Jeff. There was a brief discussion on the beavers, tires being found in the lake and a dead turtle.

A proposal was submitted to the Club to redo the horseshoe pits. The Board asked for a design and an estimate to do the project in pressure treated wood rather than Trex.

Weed treatment - As of this writing (Aug 5th), our lake has been surveyed 4 times since early June. We treated 3 times, mostly for filamentous algae, curly pond weed and starwart. In total about 8 acres, 7 of those filamentous algae. The lake looks fantastic with minimal weeds for this point in the summer. We have a plethora of Bryozoa (a colonizing algae that looks like a human brain which is usually attached to some structure in the water). This organism can only live in very clean water. Our water chemistry numbers have also been very good. The last survey at the end of July showed our DO (dissolved oxygen) was 8.65 which is very high, our PH was 7.5 which is exactly where you want it to be, water clarity was 3.5 feet, and our temperature was 78 degrees which is lower than usual for this time in July.

What has contributed to these fantastic lake conditions? One simple answer - RAIN! The heavy rains we got in July kept our water temperature down which helped to inhibit weed growth and it took much of the filamentous algae over the spillway. As I've said often, "rain is our friend here at Lake Shawnee" and it is certainly the case this year. In 40 years of overseeing the health of this lake, I can't remember our lake looking this good at this time. We stay very vigilant and survey every two weeks so we can take care of things before they get out of hand.

Geese - A very strange phenomenon has happened in Lake Shawnee. We only have 4 geese on this lake which are not here all the time. The very strange part of this is that we had 18 in March. So, what happened? Thanks to that rain again. In early May as we were getting ready to addle eggs, we received an inordinate amount of rain that flooded about three nests. We addled 3 eggs (thanks Al and Rob) that could be potential problems. All the other eggs never survived the flood. Usually when this happens, they lay again (like last year) but not this year. They must have found some other area outside the lake to nest again and lay their eggs. Those four generally come over late in the day, feed on some grass at First Beach and leave. What a pleasure to not have our beaches and docks covered with goose poop. Unfortunately, we lost our swan eggs to the heavy rain also.

Wildlife Loss – Unfortunately, I am sad to report that we had some deaths to our wildlife on the lake. Three dead beavers, one snapping turtle and a great blue heron.

Beavers - 3 dead beavers in a month is highly unusual. I consulted a wildlife biologist who has an expertise in working with beavers and this is what he shared with me. Beavers have few predators, so when you find a dead beaver, especially 3 in a month, most likely they were killed by a homeowner. Residents get upset when beavers come onto their property and cut down their trees for food and to build their lodge. Fish, Game and Wildlife will only trap beavers if the dam they make to create a pond to build their lodge is flooding their property, NOT for chewing on trees. So, residents take matters into their own hands and shoot or poison them. This is so wrong on so many levels, not to mention highly illegal with a very stiff fine. Especially when the solution to stop them from chewing is so easy to fix . Wire your affected trees about 2 feet up and they will leave them alone. Eric at True Value can set you up with what you need.

Snapping Turtle - A very large snapper was found upside down in an old tire. It could not get its head out of the water to breathe so it probably drowned. Bobbi, who runs the Fishing Committee, found it, and took care of it. (Thank you Bobbi) How that tire got in the lake I do not know. It is certainly an example of how our waste can have a tragic effect on our wildlife.

Great Blue Heron - This was found at North End near the road, but it had no signs of being hit by a car. Such a beautiful animal; it was a real loss for this lake. It added such an elegance and beauty to our lake. This was a tough one to bury. Fortunately, we have several that live here.

Well, that's it for now. I hope you have been out on the lake enjoying what it offers. We are all very lucky to live in such an amazing place. Remember we are all stewards in making sure Lake Shawnee remains a beautiful place to live.

The Lake Shawnee Tribe swim season came and went with quite a splash. Our community was well-represented across 9 exciting dual meets thanks to all of our swimmers. Major kudos to all the amazing new swimmers this season; Tyler Fedo, Gabe Goldsberry, Kaan Kockonuk, Emmie Manning and Garrett Zimmer. As with every great group of kids,

eventually they have to grow up and the team this year had to say a sad goodbye to our graduating class of swimmers "Mama" Katie Hall, Max "The Muscle" Russell, Ultimate Frisbee national championship qualifier Ethan Sarles, world traveler Michayla Vassallo and the winner of every academic and athletic award JTHS offers (and maybe some they don't): Maura White. The parents and coaches have had the honor of watching these five amazing kids mature into brilliant, responsible and, most importantly, kind leaders to the next generation in the lake.

The season opened up at home facing an overwhelming challenge in Randolph Park. While we may not have been able to pull out the win, our swimmers had quite a bit to be proud thanks to fantastic first-place finishes from Angie Andrews (Girls 8U 25M Free, Girls 8U 25 Fly), Lanie Breiten (Girls 15-18 50M Breast), Anthony Cascone (Boys 9-10 25M Breast), Madison Castle (Girls 11-12 50M Breast), Mia Fischetti (Girls 13-14 50M Breast), Brea Johnson (Girls 9-10 100M IM, Girls 9-10 25 Fly), Everett Johnson (Boys 11-12 50M Breast), Zoey Szekula (Girls 15-18 50M Back) and Kelty White (Girls 8U 25M Back).

The second meet was another home matchup against the massive Mt Olive Pirates team. Once again our Tribe swimmers kept things as close as they could but couldn't get the W for the team. Individually though, another group of swimmers picked up more strong finishes. Truly impressive performances were on display as "MadDog" Madison Castle and Ivy Jones finished 1st and 3rd in the girls 11-12 100M IM, while Everett "Dont be an Alan" Johnson brought home gold in the Boys 11-12 100M IM and "Antman" Anthony Cascone finished first in his inaugural 100M IM. Despite another tough break at the scorer's table for the team, we saw another round of outstanding results from our swimmers. Anthony Cascone repeated with a winning showing in the boys 9-10 100M IM while Brea Johnson and Sierra Crinnian proved their mettle as the Barbies took 2nd and 3rd respectively in the Girls 9-10 100M IM. Rookie of the year Tyler Fedo took home a pair of silvers thanks to some lightning quick swimming in the 8U 25M Free and Back. 
