## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT NOVEMBER/DECEMBER 2023

# SWIM TEAM NEWS

We know the brisk autumn air doesn't scream swim team, but we've got some updates to share.

After seven years in the role, Bill Szekula, has stepped down as Swim Team Board chair. All the swimmers and parents have benefitted from Bill and his hard work and dedication to our team, and we wish him well, as he gets to relax and enjoy the swim season in 2024. In Bill's place, the board has approved the nomination of one-time Lake Shawnee's "Cutest Infant" contest winner, Amy Finn-Szekula. While Amy has not previously served on the board, she has served as the league representative for the last few years along with working closely with the Swim Board and spearheading the Swim Team Snack Shack.

Another loss to the swim board in the form of Parent Liaison Julie White leaving her post following last summer's graduation of her youngest, Maura. The board owes Julie a debt of gratitude for all her hard work, especially in coordinating volunteers by turning some "I'd rather not" mentalities into "how can I help?"

Come meet the newest board members and other parents at the next parent meeting on October 26 at the Clubhouse! The board is excited to hear your ideas of how we can make the swim team and its events better for our swimmers, the coaches and the community.

The swim team is excited to announce our next fundraiser and event on December 5 as Gatwyn's will host a Dine and Donate event where a portion of all sales will be donated to the Swim Team. In addition to the great food, Coach Jamie and his chorus of swimmers will be caroling for the Lake performing holiday classics at our new fundraising event!



Being October, we do not have any recent swim meet results to honk for, but that doesn't mean we can't toot our own horns. In addition to taking home 4 medals at the finals of the NJRLL swim season, the Tribe is happy to share that Lake Shawnee's own Madison Castle-Dalton has finished up her first season of competitive swim, representing the Lifetime Metro Swim Team in the NJ State Championships. Madison didn't just make her way into the championships, she brought home some hardware, winning 2 first place gold medals in the 11/12 girls' 100M Breaststroke and 200M Free Relay, along with a silver medal in the 200M Medley Relay.

Speaking of champions, Lake Shawnee's own Maura White served as a representative of the United States at the Under-20, Beach Wrestling World Championship at Neversea Beach in Romania. The US team took third-place, thanks in part to Maura's performance at 70kg. Thanks to a pinfall victory, Maura qualified for the semifinals and left Romania having finished fourth in the World. We will keep you posted on Maura's next accomplishments at York College and Madison's further victories in coming issues, while continuing to cheer for our swimmers, alumni and neighbors.

### Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

### August 4, 2023

The American Red Cross is renting the Clubhouse August 21-25, to shoot safe swimming safety videos at 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Beaches. The purpose of the videos is to reduce drowning incidents among 5–12-year-olds for use in elementary schools.

Mr. Tom Preston is re-starting the Lake Shawnee Sailors, a popular tradition from the past.

Heart & Paw has installed a dog waste receptacle at 2<sup>nd</sup> Beach. They are responsible for emptying it.

July events Social Committee events included 2 Ice Cream Socials. (Member Chuck Saskowitz, from Denville Dog and Grill, donated the ice cream), July 22 Movie Night, July 28 Biathlon and Color War, and August 4 Pirate Day. Upcoming events are August 25 Movie Night, and September 2 End of Summer Celebration.

Solitude conducted two surveys in July and treated two acres of weeds; eight acres of weeds have been treated this year to date. The Lake Hopatcong News is coming for an interview with Mr. Jeff Keith on our Lake Ecology program on September 7th for their October edition.

The last fishing tournament was a success with a 20.5" bass and a 25.5" pickerel. A stocking is planned for this fall or next spring.

The Swim Team reported that they won twenty-one medals at the Silvers. Finals are August 5.

The Board set a date of October 28<sup>th</sup> at 11am to present a proposal for sale of Club property at North End for vote and approval of the general membership.

A memorial bench will be ordered for former Board member, Al Gazdalski.

#### September 8, 2023

Several members were in attendance to address the Board about concerns with treatments to the Lake, the effect on fishing and boating, and the recent weeds at North End. Mr. Jeff Keith explained the recent treatments, the process and the planning involved with surveying and treating the Lake, and his commitment to the healthy balance of the Lake for all to enjoy. There was a discussion on the chemicals used for treatments, the costs, and the impact on the wildlife as well as dead leaves deposited in the lake and the hydro raking process and costs. There was a brief discussion on the township's septic and leaf management programs. It was noted that the best place to get answers to any questions about the issues is to contact a Board member directly rather than post on social media.

To prevent non-members from using Club properties, no trespassing signs will be ordered; charges will be filed against the violators in the future.

The Social Committee had a great summer with lots of good feedback and great turnout for most events. Upcoming events include the Dog Walk (with the Crate Escape) and Beer Tasting both on September 23<sup>rd</sup>.

The Trading Post and Real Estate are being removed from the website as they are not being utilized by the membership.

Solitude treated 10 acres of filamentous algae with chelated copper at North End after the weeds took off due to lack of rain and warm temperatures. On August 18<sup>th</sup>, the lake was surveyed and only 3 acres were treated. Within two weeks, they took off. The treatment had been delayed due to vacation but should only take a day or two to take effect. Several boaters reported eel grass; diquat was used to treat along the shoreline and it should dissipate soon. We had a great summer except for the past three weeks regarding the weeds.

Summer Night Security had a calm summer with mostly reports of cars parking on Club properties after hours due to the paving project in the Lake; Lifeguard and Summer Security also had an uneventful summer.

The Swim Team held their annual end of season banquet, and they honored 6 graduating seniors. They had many attend Trials and 10 advanced to Finals. Swim lanes and flags will be removed tomorrow.

ProSeal resealed and repainted the basketball courts and Mr. Bill Carroll, 2<sup>nd</sup> Beach Property Manager, reset the parking stops. He would like to thank Tyne Bardwell, Curtis Dalton, Matt Dallicardillo and Kevin Cotto for assisting.

The Board received a bid for the horseshoe pits (wood vs. Trex) and after a brief discussion on the project voted to approve the to accept the bid of \$673 to complete the project in wood with all the materials paid for by the Club and the work completed by the members.

### Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

### September 8, 2023, continued

The Board discussed and approved updates to the Standing Rules including additions and/or changes to open fires, fireworks, dogs, illegal activities and music on Club properties sections.

The hydro raking committee will reconvene next year to discuss future projects and to address the recent weed issues.

The Board discussed and voted to approve increasing the following fees: credit card convenience fee from \$10 to \$15, dues late fee from \$50 to \$100, initiation fee for new members (as of April 1<sup>st</sup>) from \$500 to double the regular annual dues (currently \$980), and Clubhouse rental fees from \$250 to \$300 with the deposit remaining the same (as of January 1<sup>st</sup>).

#### October 6, 2023

Appendix A for fees was revised and post in the members only section of the website.

Notices were sent to members who had trees that were in violation of the Club's policies (overhanging or falling into the Lake). One member has already removed the trees.

Membership is currently up to 508 vs 496 from this time last year.

The Social Committee reported that Fall Movie Night for tomorrow was cancelled due to weather forecast. Upcoming events include Halloween Storytime on October 12<sup>th</sup>, Trunk or Treat on Oct. 15<sup>th</sup>, Dog Walk and Costume Parade rescheduled due to weather for Oct. 21<sup>st</sup>, and Texas Hold 'em on October 28<sup>th</sup>. The November 7<sup>th</sup> Social Committee Meeting will be their 2024 planning meeting; anyone interested in hosting an event should plan to attend. The recent Beer Tasting event had 31 in attendance.

Mr. Keith and our old engineer from Solitude, Mr. Jeff Horn, completed a two-hour survey of the lake recently. It was noted that there is a fishing contest tomorrow and there have been no recent treatments. Mr. Keith will continue to work along with the Fishing Committee to provide and schedule treatments. There has been some flowering tape grass noticed in the lake recently; at the time of the survey, they were in the process of dying. Tape grass has not been treated this year; a large amount was treated several years ago with Procelacor, a pricey but effective treatment that provided several years of coverage, but the residual effects are beginning to wear off. During the survey, they also noticed some filamentous and variegated milfoil; we will need to address this next year. Jeremey from Solitude was an excellent technician for the season.

The October edition of the Lake Hopatcong News features an article about Mr. Jeff Keith and our Lake Ecology program.

The Board discussed and approved cancelling Fall Workday on November 4th; we will post a list of the jobs as provided by the property managers online (Facebook and Signup Genius) to be completed by the membership as available.

A recent fishing contest went very well and there is another one scheduled tomorrow despite the bad weather predicted. The Fishing Committee will hold their annual fishing banquet on December 3rd. After planning their 2024 calendar, they will coordinate with Mr. Keith to service the lake either one week before or after each event. There was a brief discussion on placing containers on Club properties for disposal of fishing lines and lures as well as scheduling ice fishing contest which is a big fundraiser for the committee.

It was reported that Mr. Bill Szekula has stepped down as Swim Team Chairperson. Nominations for New Swim Team Board include Parent Liaison Ed Crinnian replacing Julie White, Chrissy Cumberton for Secretary for one more year, Treasurer Chang Lee, Co-Chairs Kira Crinnian and Amy Szekula, NJRLL Rep. and Snack Shack Coordinator Amy Szekula, Facilities Coordinator Pete Kuhl, Team News Reporter Ed Crinnian. The nominations were approved Board. There will be one more parent meeting for the year to discuss Lake Shawnee hosting Trails and Finals next year, which was discussed by the Board, as well.

Recent work on Club properties included painting the front and kitchen doors of the Clubhouse, planting five ornamental grasses and Hosta in the front garden area, removal of the swim ropes, and repainting of the lines on the basketball court.

Estimates will be obtained for dock repair/replacement projects at the Clubhouse, White's Cove and North End, to be completed during the next lake drawdown. Once received, a 5-year Capital Improvement Committee will meet to discuss the list of projects with the priority being the docks.

Notices for Special Meeting scheduled for October 28<sup>th</sup> have been sent to the membership in the required 10 days notification deadline for such meetings.

<u>Weed Treatment</u> - As mentioned in my last article, we have had one of our best summers in a long time. We had minimal weeds (except for an algae outbreak in the middle of June, which was highly unusual). The next 7-8 weeks were uneventful with minimal weeds and algae, high chemistry numbers, especially our DO (dissolved oxygen) which were all very good. We only had a handful of geese which was very welcoming and water temperatures never got above 80 degrees. These great numbers were attributed to a lot of rain and being surveyed every two weeks. We were able to take care of any algae immediately before it became a problem. Our thanks go out to Jeremy, the biologist from Solitude, who made the effort to be here so frequently even with the many lakes he has to service. Also mentioned in last month's article, the bulk of our treatment was filamentous algae. After June, we rarely had more than 1 to 3 acres at the most, which we treated immediately. This constant vigilance was key to keeping our algae problem at a minimum.

Well, as most of you know if you were on the lake the last week of August into the first week of September, things changed. So, let me explain what happened earlier. We treated about 3 acres of the lake for filamentous algae on Aug. 18th. Those 3 acres were spread over about 50 acres from North End to past the launch at White's Cove. As was our practice all summer, no matter how little there was, we treated it. (Just a reminder to swimmers, like myself, and fishermen, we use a "chelated" copper

sulfate to treat algae. Chelated means it has a sticking agent in it, so most of the herbicide attaches to the algae with a minimal amount going into the water stream. It is very safe and does not affect any wildlife in the lake, including small invertebrates which are the beginning of the food chain.) This costs more money per acre but its' effectiveness and safety to the wildlife in the lake is well worth it.

So back to Aug 18th when we treated. I went on vacation on the 19th feeling that the minor treatment the day before would carry us until I got back. Unfortunately, we had days in the 90s the next two weeks along with no rain. These were perfect conditions for algae, from North End and along the coves on the western shore, to take off. As I was still away, I received a call from Eric, our President, of the situation just before Labor Day and I immediately called it in to Jeremy from Solitude. The earliest he could come on such short notice was the following week. He came on Thursday of that next week and treated 10 acres of filamentous algae in those areas mentioned earlier. By Sunday after treatment, it all looked good again. I apologize for not having Solitude here earlier so things would not have gotten out of hand. This is a reminder that our vigilance of surveying every two weeks in July and August was so important. It is also a reminder how weather plays such an important part in how fast things can take off when not addressed. Again, my apologies to boaters and residents on the lake in that area who had to deal with that mess before we treated. Hopefully, this won't happen again.

<u>Leaves</u> - Leaves are falling so if you live on the lake, please try to get them up so they don't end up in the lake and eventually become sediment on the bottom. It's important for all of us to rake up leaves and discard them properly because the wind will blow them into the road and rain will take them into the catch basins which all drain into the lake. Remember, it takes a village no matter where you live.

Lastly, I want to thank Karen Fucito and Micheal Daigle for their great article in the Lake Hopatcong News about Lake Shawnee.
