I must remind everyone that badges should be worn or available and especially so for any member guests. We ask that you please do not simply invite friends to utilize the lake without you being present or without issuing them a guest badge. It is all too common to hear from non-members on the lake that they know someone and it becomes difficult to verify. Keep in mind NJ Fish & Game requires a fishing license for anyone over 16 even on private lakes. Please be courteous to our residents and do not use gas-powered ice augers before 8 am. All our ice fishing rules are posted on our website.

Please mark your calendar for our Annual Meeting which is scheduled for Saturday, March $16^{\rm th}$ at $11~\rm am.$

Last, thank you to the many members over the past year who donated their time and have contributed so much to make Lake Shawnee such a wonderful community!

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
Ice Safety

Outdoor ice sports and activities can be safe and enjoyable, but there is no such thing as 100 percent safe ice. Anyone who spends time near the ice should first determine the ice conditions, and then take precautions to stay safe.

Preventing Ice Accidents

- Follow these guidelines to avoid accidents when on or near ice:
- Check the ice thickness before going out. To be safe, ice should be solid and at least 4 inches thick. Remember, the ice may not be the same thickness over the entire area of a lake or pond. Test ice thickness by using a chisel, cordless drill or ice auger.
- Be safe—the more people on the ice, the thicker it should be.
- Use ice on smaller, shallower and slower-moving bodies of water for ice activities, it is usually more solid.
- Look for objects sticking up through the ice and mark them as hazards.
- Do not go out on ice that has recently frozen, thawed and then frozen again. This happens in the spring and early winter as temperatures change often. Wait until the outside temperature has been below freezing long enough that at least 4 inches of solid ice forms over the entire area.
- Always stay with at least one other person.

Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

November 2, 2018

The Social Committee reported on recent events including Beer Tasting event and the Annual Trunk or Treat. Upcoming events include Texas Hold 'em, Pallet Painting, Gift Making, and Book Club. The Winter Carnival is proposed a week earlier this year with football on blow up screen. Finally, the Social Committee planning meeting for the upcoming year will be held the yearly calendar will be available in the next edition of the LSNews. It was noted that the Lake is getting very clear at this time of the year. An end of the year report from Solitude will be available in time for the Annual Meeting.

The Fall Work Day was scheduled for November 3rd. Tree trimming and leaf clean-up was needed on all properties.

It was reported that "Scoot on Down" has been booked to play at this year's Community Day event.

It was reported that the Fishing Committee is selling calendars featuring photos of the Lake from members as a fundraiser for \$20.

It was decided that the Board will choose a contractor for the Clubhouse renovation project by the beginning of the year.

There was a brief discussion on updating the new Boat Policy. It was noted that we added racks, which helped the situation, but it was decided to review limiting the number of permits per household prior to next summer.

There was a brief discussion on annual lowering of the lake. It was noted that the next scheduled lowering is 2020.

December 7, 2018

Club attorney, Ms. Eileen Born will do a bylaw review to check with our compliance with the new laws.

The Lake Shawnee Seniors Christmas party will be held on December 19th.

It was noted that the Budget Committee will reconvene at the beginning of the year. All property managers will submit their projects for the upcoming year.

It was noted that the Fishing Committee recently held their annual banquet.

The Board approved an expense to replace a large window in the Clubhouse at a cost of \$1000 and an expense to replace the lights on the Message Board.

It was noted that tree trimming at First Beach was completed and Bartlett Tree Service evaluated all the trees on the property. It was reported that the main tree on First Beach is dead and will need to be removed most likely in the fall. The Board plans to plant other shade trees in the spring. When we begin the Clubhouse renovation, we can complete all tree trimming and removal at the same time.

The Board plans to finalize all bids for the Clubhouse renovation and make a final decision by January. We will wait on obtaining a variance, if needed, until we hire a contractor.

Nomination notice for Board positions was included in the last edition of the LSNews. All current members are interested in another term.

Repairs needed on the dam are incomplete because the water level has been too high. The repairs will need to wait until the spring or until the lake level is lower.

The Board discussed and approved giving member Alicia Szwec access to manage the Lake Shawnee website, as well as assisting in layout and quality of advertising submissions in the LSNews. Ms. Szwec is a graphic designer and volunteered her services to the Club.
