MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT NOVEMBER/DECEMBER 2024

I wish all our members and your families a Happy Thanksgiving, Merry Christmas, and Happy Hanukkah.

As many know by now, I would certainly be remiss if I didn't mention the passing of a lake icon, long-time member, and the longest-serving Board member ever, Milt Felter, on September 22nd.

I have so many fond memories of serving with Milt on the Lake Shawnee Board and as a young whipper snapper growing up here as a kid. Milt was known as the Mayor of Lake Shawnee. Everyone knew him; if you didn't, he would ensure you did! Milt and Joan moved here from the Paterson area in 1960. Milt has been on the Lake Shawnee Board for, we believe, at least 50 years. Milt loved this community and served it well on the Board and various committees. Milt has been our Membership Vice-President for as long as anyone could remember. As a new lake member, you would get a Milt visit, and he would provide a welcome packet and a bottle of wine. You were expected to open the bottle and drink it with him! You would often see Milt driving around the lake a few times daily, checking on any new houses for sale to track new potential members. Until recently, you could find him at the message board at First Beach updating the sign for any new lake events.

I have served with Milt on the Board since I joined it in 2002. He was always willing to help and talk and often shared his vast knowledge of the lake. We even did a lake history presentation together a few years ago. No one cherished this community more. A few years ago, before we renovated the clubhouse and before COVID, Milt would host Saturday morning coffee. Many came down to chat and get Milt riled up about politics! Milt was a staunch Democrat, and you could easily get him going!

As a young kid growing up here, Milt would chase us off club property during the night security patrols, and we would run away before he could catch us. We would hide, yelling, "Uncle Milty!" We tortured the poor guy even back then!

Milt's wish (and running joke!) was to erect a statue in his honor with him pointing down the lake from the First Beach. I am not sure we could pull off a statue, but we will find a fitting tribute! Milt was a great guy all around. I will miss him dearly. The lake will not be the same without him. Rest in Peace, Milt! I am sure you are dancing in heaven with Joan!

This is a reminder that all boats must be removed from all Club properties this year. This allows the Club to purge unused boats and perform any work necessary on the racks. Our Club policy is that all boats are to be removed from Club property by November 1 of any Presidential election year and can be returned after April 1 once a new storage permit is obtained.

As you can see, our lake has been drawn down. We perform a 3-4 foot drawdown each Presidential election year so lakefront residents can perform any lakefront cleanup and repair walls and docks. If you install a new seawall, a State permit is required. No permit is needed if you have or are repairing an existing wall. I ask all lakefront residents to please take this time to perform any lakefront cleanup and be sure to remove any downed trees and debris that may have fallen into the lake.

Our fall cleanup is scheduled for Saturday, November 9, at 8:30 am. All will meet at White's Cove on West Lakeview Trl. Light breakfast available. We hope to replace the dock at the North End and at White's Cove.. We had work done at 2nd beach which is finished by removing the existing walkway and installing a new block wall. We also recently performed some tree work on our Club properties.

Enjoy the fall while it lasts!

Weed Treatment- As usual in late August, we had a small breakout of filamentous Algae from North End to the launch which totaled 4 acres. Those small coves in that area are perfect for algae to take off. The nutrients that come into the lake from two feeder streams come around the island and settle there. It was treated with chelated copper sulfate which sticks to the plant and is very effective.

We also have about two acres of tape grass in and around the large patch of lilies off Island Trail. They were in the process of dying so we left them alone. We have to keep a close watch on this plant which can spread very quickly so we will budget accordingly for next year so we can control this species in case it gets out of control. Interestingly, we had several other patches of this plant in early August, but much of it was found floating on the surface and on our beaches. Our biologist explained why this was happening. It involves the pontoon boats on the lake. The water was very warm (86 degrees at one time) so when the blades hit the tape grass it did not cut the plant, it just pulled it right off the bottom (the lake bottom gets very soft when the water is very warm because most of the grass found on the beaches had the roots still attached). The good news with this scenario is that with the roots gone, we will not have to treat it. Jeff, our biologist, said he has seen this when water gets very warm. So, thank you pontoon owners.

In other news, we took samples of the lake bottom in about six areas so they could be tested for any toxins that would prohibit us from finding a source to get rid of it when we hydro rake. We are researching a company that can take a lot of material out of the lake when we get the proper permits and someone who could use the material as fill for a project they are working on. This was the first step in that process.

Good news for fishermen. I learned from Jeff (the biologist) that the light green material is a different species of filamentous algae. We never treat it because it will break down and dissipate on its own. Small bait fish hide in it from predators (larger fish) so as Jeff reminds us, it is a great place to fish. From his experience of talking to many fishermen they have a lot of success in those areas. So, give it a try!

Lastly, it is that time of the year when our yards are inundated with leaves. So, this comment is mostly for those who live on the lake. I know homeowners would not blow their leaves into the lake, but there have been instances where I have seen people hired to do this work take the short cut and blow them into the lake. I am not picking on landscapers because most will not do that, but please just confirm with them that they cannot do this. If they're new to working in Lake Shawnee they may be tempted or do not realize those leaves will eventually turn into soil. Thank you!

Milt was a Board member for over 40 years. If there was a job to be done on this lake, he was the first to volunteer. One of the many duties he had on the Board was to visit new members in the lake and deliver the welcome packet so they were familiar with how the Club works and of course drop off a complimentary bottle of wine which all new members received. (I am sure Milt encouraged these new neighbors to open the bottle and have a glass with him).

The lake lost an icon and I lost a very good friend. I knew Milt for over forty years. I also served on the Board with Milt for 30 years where we became close friends and worked on many projects for the lake. Whatever the task was that we were working on, we always seem to have fun. Many knew Milt was an avid Rutgers fan who had two season tickets to the football games and I was fortunate enough to be invited to attend those games with Milt. He loved his Scarlet Knights. The tailgating was as much fun as the game. For many years Milt helped me open and close my house in LBI. At times we had some "difficulties" and I thought "what a guy and what a good friend" for helping me do this and then I realized he was motivated by the promise of several Martinis when we were done. He once volunteered to help me drive to Colorado with my van to deliver things for my son who had recently moved there. Well, driving straight through with minimal sleep we had a few scary moments staying awake (if you want to hear the REAL story, ask me sometime). Milt lived on the lake and he was kind enough to let me keep all my watercraft there. (I called it Milt's Marina). When I would come back from my lake survey or from paddling & swimming a few times a week, Milt would have a VT (vodka tonic) waiting for me. We would sit in his gazebo and talk politics, lake business and life. These are the times I will miss the most.

Milt was a kind, gentle, generous person who was always ready to help. Lake Shawnee is a better place because of him and I am a better person for knowing him.

Rest in Peace my good friend, you are now back together with Joan, the love of your life!

Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

September 6, 2024

It was reported that several dead trees were found on Club properties and will be removed.

It was a great summer with great turnouts at all social events. Upcoming events include Poker Night on the 13th, as well as the Dog Walk on the 21st. This year's event had lots of sponsors and hopes are to grow it into something bigger in the future possibly including an adoption day.

Several samples were taken for the anticipated hydro raking project following the drawdown, which will be sent to the lab for testing. The lake was treated after filamentous began taking off. There is some tape grass in several patches, which has begun flowering; with the warm weather, it will begin breaking loose and dying off. These areas will need to be watched and treatments will need to be added to the budget for next year. In mid-September, seven or eight lilies will need to be removed, keeping one big patch for the fishermen. There was some purple loose strife found by the islands and in other areas that will be removed in the fall.

It was reported that a survey was completed of the trees along the shoreline that are falling into the Lake; letters will be sent to all homeowners to remove.

With the drawdown, boats will be removed and work will be done on the racks on fall work day. Any remaining boats, the owners will be notified; any unclaimed boats will be sold in the spring. Native Fields will handle the leaves.

Summer Night Security had an uneventful summer.

It was noted that there were issues with a lack of guards especially at the end of the season and many days the beaches had no guards on duty. The Board will address these issues by hiring guards earlier for next season and outlining expectations and duties of all guards hired.

The Board discussed the recent Kid's Fishing Event which was a huge success.

Trials and Finals as hosted by Lake Shawnee ran smoothly and we received lots of positive feedback and compliments from the entire league. The team had lots of help and it was a great event. The final parent meeting of the season was held on August 22nd and the new Board was announced. The Team will be breaking down the swim lanes this Sunday.

Several projects were discussed including toilet repairs and treating for carpenter ants at the Clubhouse, docking replacement at North End, and repairing/replacing the rip rap at the bottom of the dam.

The company hired to redo our plans for Phase II of the dam repairs requested a topographic map of our lake bed. Mr. Matriciano made a plea on Facebook for any members with sonar on their boats; Tom and Cathy Flatt responded. They took measurements which were sent to the company and saved the Club lots of money.

The Board discussed updating Standing Rules regulating business on Club property. Our insurance company recommends businesses have insurance including Workmen's Compensation for any employees. This included prohibiting lifeguards from offering private swim lessons or the ice cream truck selling on Club property without a vendor agreement and providing proof of insurance.

The Board discussed and approved a resolution allowing the Club to offer easements on properties previously offered for sale in the lot line adjustments, due to the recent changes from our SBA loan regarding liens on the properties (not including the land at North End).

The Board was updated on the upcoming seawall project at 2nd Beach.

Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

October 4, 2024

The Board discussed the recent passing of long time Board member Milt Felter including a memorial and celebration of life/dedication to be planned. The Board discussed and approved Ms. Dina Troha to replace Mr. Felter's position as VP of Membership as nominated by Club President per Club bylaws.

The sluice gate was opened for the Lake lowering on October 2nd. The Social Committee held a successful Dog Walk and Pet Parade with 20 dogs; donations were made to Father John's Rescue. Upcoming events include Fall Movie Night, Poker, Halloween Storytime, Beer Tasting and Trunk or Treat.

The lake was surveyed and there was about 2 acres of tape grass found which is dying off. Another survey will be done in the upcoming weeks to assess the lake and determine the plan for treatments for next year in order to budget accordingly. The lake bottom samples were completed and we await the results from the lab testing.

The Board discussed the recent COLA meeting held last Saturday including new law regarding financial reserve requirements of lake associations and the impact on our Club.

Fall Work Day is scheduled for Saturday, November 9th. Work to be completed includes repairing boat racks and removal of wooden dock at North End, removal of large rocks at dock, removal of ramp and repairing racks at White's Cove. 8:30 Breakfast at the Snack Shack and 9 am work to begin.

The Fishing Committee provided a report on their recent event. Their annual Fishing Banquet will be held on October 27th, where they will determine next year's fishing dates which will include an ice fishing contest in Jan. or Feb.

A cafeteria hot plate holder was donated to the Club which will be made available for renters and Club events.

The Board discussed the upcoming project at 2nd Beach for a new sea wall. The block has been ordered and the work will begin after the drawdown begins.

The Board discussed and approved the purchase of new floating dock system to replace the old wooden dock at North End and the dock and ramp at White's Cove.

It was reported the JP Tree Service was contacted to remove several trees on Club properties that were determined to be dead or dying.
