Summary of Lake Shawnee Club Board Meeting April 7, 2017

The Board discussed the recent Annual Meeting on March 11th and completed their annual Board reorganization.

Upcoming events for the Social Committee include the Annual Bunny Brunch and Easter Egg Hunt on Sunday, April 9th. Once again, the Club held a successful Wine Tasting on March 25th thanks to Vince and Gina Matrisciano.

The Board discussed treatments for the Lake for the upcoming season to begin at the end of April. Egg addling will be conducted, as well.

Projects and plans for the upcoming Work Day on April 22nd were discussed. The Board will present proposals for all anticipated projects for the upcoming year at the next monthly Board meeting.

Sign ups for Swim Team will be held on April 22nd at the Clubhouse.

There was a brief discussion on plans Phase 2 of the dam reconstruction including a preliminary timeline.

The Board discussed the anticipated Clubhouse renovation, specifically the septic system requirements for the project. Engineering calculations are being provided and will be submitted to the town upon completion.

The Board discussed several upcoming projects. They voted to paint and repair the far dock at First Beach, rather than replace with composite material as proposed by the Swim Team at the March Board Meeting. They discussed repairs to the Clubhouse and decided to hold off on any major projects until the status of the Clubhouse renovation has been determined. Plans are on hold until the status of the septic has been determined. The Board approved to replace the fencing at 2nd Beach and to install two swinging gates at the top of the lower stairs. They discussed repairs to the top stairs, but need to obtain further estimates for the work. Finally, the Board discussed and approved the replacement of the chains at the First Beach parking lot with timber railings.

The Board discussed revisions to the Club's Memorial Policy and the Events Policies.



Beach Rules

Current ID badges must be displayed while on all Club properties.

All Club properties must be vacated by 10:00 p.m.

Swim at your own risk when lifeguards are not on duty or not present.

Children under age 12 must be accompanied by a responsible person age 14 or older.

Unprotected glass containers are prohibited on beach properties. Glass containers when utilized must be in a protective or insulating container to prevent breakage

Bicycles or motorized vehicles are not permitted on the beaches.

Pets are prohibited on beach properties between Memorial Day and Labor Day.

All garbage and personal belongings must be removed each day.

Cigarette butts are not to be disposed of on Club property.

No sitting or hanging on the swim ropes or swim lanes.

When life guards are on duty, swimmers are not permitted to go outside the designated swim area. The swim area shall be determined by the lifequards.

No rough play, pushing or shoving.

No swimming under rafts or docks.

One person at a time on any ladders.

Authority of the lifeguards and security persons must be respected. The lifeguards have the right to remove anyone from the property for not following the rules or acting in an unsafe or disrespectful manner.

But now that we have more & more larger boats on the lake it is important to remind our members of a few of the NJ State regulations regarding boats. Even though we are a private lake, boaters must still comply with State Laws.

In addition children under 12 in kayaks, canoes are required to wear a USCG-approved PFD while on the lake.

Navigational Lights (while operating at night)

Power-driven vessels:

If vessel construction began after December 24, 1981 and the boat is 12 meters (39 feet) **or more** in length, it must display:

- · A green light on the starboard (right) side of the boat
- A red light on the port (left) side of the boat
- A masthead light (225 degrees) and a stern light (135 degrees).

If vessel construction began after December 24, 1981 and the boat *is under* 12 meters (39 feet) in length, it may exhibit the same lights required for vessels under 20 meters when the construction was started before December 25, 1981.

Sailing Vessels and Vessels under Oars:

Sailing vessels under sail alone must display:

- Red and green sidelights visible from a distance of at least one mile on a dark clear night
- · A stern light visible from a distance of at least two miles.

Sailing vessels of less than 7 meters (22 feet) must display, and vessels under oars may display, if practicable, the lights prescribed above, but if not, it must have ready at hand an electric torch or lighted lantern showing a white light.

Vessel Registration

Boats that fit into the following categories do not have to be registered:

- A non-powered sailboat or vessel used only on small lakes, ponds or within private lands;
- Vessels 12 feet or less in length;
- A non-powered kayak or canoe.

Personal Floatation Device (PFD)

All vessels, except surfboards, racing shells, rowing sculls and racing kayaks, must be equipped with one PFD of the correct size for each person onboard.

All PFD's must be readily accessible and in serviceable condition.

Vessels more than 16 feet in length must carry one Type IV (throwable) USCG-approved flotation device in addition to the required number of wearable type PFD's.

Mandatory PFD Usage

All children 12 years old and under must wear a USCG-approved PFD while onboard <u>any vessel</u> including kayaks, canoes that is underway. The PFD may be removed if the child is inside a fully enclosed, permanent part of the vessel that is designed by the manufacturer to carry passengers.
