I have to remind everyone that badges should be worn or available and especially so for any member guests. We ask that you please do not simply invite friends to utilize the lake without you being present or without issuing them a guest badge. It is all too common to hear from non-members on the lake that they know someone, and it becomes difficult to verify. Keep in mind NJ Fish & Game requires a fishing license for anyone over 16 even on private lakes. Please be courteous to our residents and please no gas-powered ice augers before 8 am. All our ice fishing rules are posted on our website.

Please mark your calendar for our Annual Meeting which is scheduled for Saturday, March 10th at 11 am.

We need a quorum of approx. 50 members to conduct business. If you have never been to an Annual Meeting it is an opportunity for our Board of Governors and its' committees to report to the membership all the activities of the Club for the past year. Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meeting

January 5, 2018

The Social Committee reported on the 2017 Great Light Fight. The East side was the overall winner; individual winners were East Side 1st Place Gast – 32 East Shawnee Trail and West Side 1st Place Troha – 3 Shenandoah Crescent. They are currently planning the Winter Carnival for January 29th and are optimistic that with all the cold weather, they will be able to hold the event again after 2 years of cancelling due to no ice. Member, Pat Reis, will be offering Ballroom dance lessons on Mondays for six weeks in February and March for free. Card Night will resume in March (hiatus in January and February). Upcoming events include Pallet Painting on January 12th, Kids Cooking Class with Vince Matrisciano on Feb. 19th and Adult 80's Night on Feb. 17th.

The recent hydro raking project came in way under budget at only \$6600. There was a brief discussion on putting the waste matter on the islands. It was explained that this process is much more efficient and effective; the islands can then be used as habitat refuge for monarch butterflies.

The Board discussed and approved updates to the Club's Standing Rules, which include several revisions to include the new Boat Storage Policy.

Ice Safety

Outdoor ice sports and activities can be safe and enjoyable, but there is no such thing as 100 percent safe ice. Anyone who spends time near the ice should first determine the ice conditions, and then take precautions to stay safe.

Preventing Ice Accidents

- Follow these guidelines to avoid accidents when
- on or near ice:
- Check the ice thickness before going out. To be safe, ice should be solid and at least 4 inches thick. Remember, the ice may not be the same thickness over the entire area of a lake or pond. Test ice thickness by using a chisel, cordless drill or ice auger.
- Be safe—the more people on the ice, the thicker it should be.
- Use ice on smaller, shallower and slower-moving bodies of water for ice activities, it is usually
- more solid.
- Look for objects sticking up through the ice and mark them as hazards.
- Do not go out on ice that has recently frozen, thawed and then frozen again. This happens in the spring and early winter as temperatures change often. Wait until the outside temperature has been below freezing long enough that at least 4 inches of solid ice forms over the entire area.
- Always stay with at least one other person.

- No use of gas-powered augers before 8 AM
- No fishing closer than 50 feet from the shore of anyone's property unless it is your own
- No fishing closer than 100 feet from the Beach areas and directly behind the Clubhouse
- Drill no more than ten holes per person per day
- Return all fish to the Lake alive that you do not intend to eat or otherwise take with you
- When leaving, take everything off the ice with you, including fish, garbage, coals, firewood, cans, etc.
- No glass bottles allowed on the ice at any time
- · No fires allowed on the ice other than cooking on a grill
- Member or guest badges must be worn while on the ice

These rules must be followed in order for all of us to continue enjoying our ice fishing on Lake Shawnee!



Just before midnight on Wednesday- January 17, 2018 - Anita Norris was released from her long suffering battle against Cancer and taken to her heavenly reward. I say that with complete confidence having had the honor of calling Anita my friend for over 20 years. It was hard to plan a date out on Lake Shawnee with Anita as she was involved in so many worthwhile organizations. Really involved. Even while undergoing horrific Cancer treatments, Anita still managed to trek down from her "house on the hill" to fulfill her scheduled duties as an official member of the volunteer squadron that constantly work to preserve our LIGHTHOUSES. Ms. Norris was also a dedicated and extremely active member of the volunteer organization dedicated to preserving not just the historical significance but also the remaining physical structures of the CANAL NETWORKS which were the transportation networks of the NorthEast, especially NJ, before the Rail Roads. Anita was a living Encyclopedia of Lake Shawnee History.
